Legal/Regulatory



Friday, June 26th, Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order (EO) 2020-136 into effect. This EO restricts entry into health care facilities. Until July 25th, any visitors who are not necessary for daily operations or a parent, Power of Attorney/guardian will not be allowed in. This order replaces and rescinds EO 2020-108 which expired June 26, 2020. You can read both orders below:

Employee/Safety



The CDC has issued guidance on SARS-CoV-2 the underlying virus that causes COVID-19 in animals. Some of the key points are the CDC doesn't recommend routine testing of animals and encourages Veterinarians to rule out other, more common causes of illness before considering COVID-19 testing. As of right now there continues to be no evidence COVID-19 can spread from animals to

humans. However, there are some cases where animals have become infected from people.

U.S. Small Business
Administration

On June 15th the Small Business Administration (SBA) began accepting new applications for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) and Advances. These advances can be up to \$10,000 and do not have to be repaid. Any applications made before April 15th will be processed first and any new applications will be processed on a first come first serve basis.

The Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) partnered with Michigan Women Forwards in announcing the creation of a 1.5 million Michigan Entrepreneur Resilience Fund. The fund is meant to help entrepreneurs and small businesses impacted by COVID-19 recover. This fund offers \$1,000-\$5,000 grants and microloans of \$5,000-\$10,000 to small businesses.
