After passing both chambers, on Saturday, July 4th President Trump signed S. 4116 into effect. This bill reauthorized the Paycheck Protection Program. Initially PPP loan assistance for small businesses which had been set to expire June 30th and with this bill has now been extended through August 8th.

U.S. Small Business Administration

On June 15th the Small Business Administration (SBA) began accepting new applications for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) and Advances. These advances can be up to \$10,000 and do not have to be repaid. Any applications made before April 15th will be processed first and any new applications will be processed on a first come first serve basis.

The Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) partnered with Michigan Women Forwards in announcing the creation of a 1.5 million Michigan Entrepreneur Resilience Fund. The fund is meant to help entrepreneurs and small businesses impacted by COVID-19 recover. This fund offers \$1,000-\$5,000 grants and microloans of \$5,000-\$10,000 to small businesses. Applications are being accepted NOW and the program will continue until all funds are exhausted. Grant Applications will close on Wednesday, July 8th at midnight.
