The FDA has added an additional two dozen hand sanitizers that contain toxic wood alcohol, all of which are manufactured in Mexico. These products are sold by Mexico-based company 4E Global which carries the Blumen label. There are now 55 varieties of hand sanitizers on the FDA's list of toxic products. Using these products can cause blindness, hospitalization, or even death and anyone who may have used one of these products should immediately seek medical care. You can view the full list below:

The CDC has released statistics following a study on COVID-19 during pregnancy. The findings conclude that pregnant women are more likely to be hospitalized and are at increased risk for ICU admission and receipt of mechanical ventilation over nonpregnant women. However, as of right now pregnant women are at no higher risk of death than nonpregnant women. The CDC is continually collecting data and will continue to update their findings to reflect their dataset.

Governor Whitmer has signed Executive Order (EO) 2020-145 into effect. This order mandates safeguards to protect Michigan's workers from COVID-19. This order takes effect immediately and rescinds EO 2020-114. The Construction Industry's requirements are outlined in Section 3 of the order beginning on page 5. You can read the document in its entirety below:



Governor Whitmer has signed Executive Order (EO) 2020-147 into effect. This order mandates businesses can refuse service to customers without a mask similar to "no shirt, no shoes, no service" regulations. A mask must be worn when in an indoor public space, outdoors when unable to remain 6' apart from others, or in ride-sharing transportation. This order takes

On June 15th the Small Business Administration (SBA) began accepting new

applications for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) and Advances. These advances can be up to \$10,000 and do not have to be repaid. Any applications made before April 15th will be processed first and any new applications will be processed on a first come first serve basis.
